Who is Eligible	Public and nonprofit private entities that include states, localities, and coordinated networks of such entities. Faith-based and CBOs that meet the eligibility requirements are eligible. Priority given to entities that have experience in providing shelter and services to runaway, homeless, or street youth.

Submission Method	Grants.gov
Budget Information	Categories: Personnel, Fringe Benefits, Travel, Equipment, Supplies, Contractual, Other, Indirect Charges. No construction. No needle distribution activities.
Match Required?	Yes. Must match 10% of the total approved project cost. Can be in-kind or cash, but cash is encouraged.
Purpose of the Grant Program	The purpose of the SOP is to provide prevention services to runaway, homeless, and street youth who have been subjected to, or are at risk of being subjected to, sexual abuse, prostitution, sexual exploitation, and severe forms of trafficking in persons.
Project Period	36 months, starting 9/30/16
Available Funding	There will be 46 awards of \$90k-\$200k per budget period. The average projected award is \$162,051 per budget period.
Program Deliverables	SOPs provide services to youth living on the streets and in unstable situations by reaching out to where they are. SOPs projects aim to increase young people's personal safety, well-being, and self-sufficiency, and help them build permanent connections with caring adults and community members with the goal of getting them off the streets. SOP also responds to the needs of youth victims of severe forms of human trafficking by identifying and building rapport to meet their basic needs and connecting them with comprehensive services. Project components include outreach, gateway services, harm reduction, access to emergency shelter, crisis stabilization, continuum service linkages, aftercare, follow up, optional drop in center. Performance indicators relate to numbers of youth served by various program components.
Evaluation Potential	Evaluation is required. Does not specify external evaluator, this this is listed as a potential cost in the Contractual budget section. Must submit logic model.
